
Mrs Marged Miles Farrier



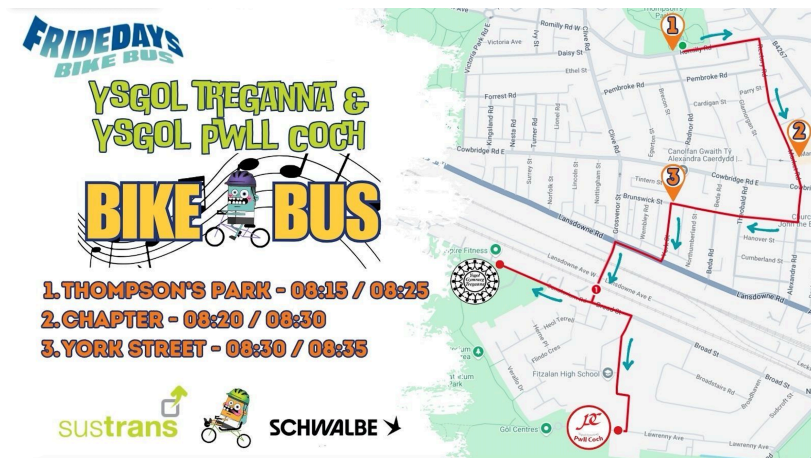
BOOK FAIR
